Ms. Morton asks: Is there a high school fair going as well?

Ms. Atkinson responds –yes.

Morton: Is there a list of schools that will be in attendance at that fair?

Ms. Atkinson says she will reach out to Mr. Meeks and have him share the list with Ms. Morton.

Mr. Henry posed a question to parents: How would you go about getting parents to enroll their students at Ebbets Field Middle School?

Ms. Hippolyte - says that we can do mass mailing —create a flier and have it mailed within a certain radius of the school to parents with 5th graders. A company does the mailing.

Ms.Atkinson suggests that our guidance counselor can also reach out to elementary guidance counselors and obtain a mailing list for 5th graders.

MEETING TOPIC: CEP Goals

Ms. Atkinson shares the school's vision as a starting point to get into the specific CEP goals. She reviews both the vision and mission. Vision: All stakeholders are invested in the success of our students.

She explains that the CEP goals are crafted around priority areas/needs: Supportive Environment -

Goal 1 - By June 2023 - the practices related to social emotional support will improve by 10% from 60% to 70% measured by the positive NYC School survey and this will result in improved collaborative and trusting relationship between students and teachers

Goal 2 - By June 2023 - the practices related to social emotional support will move 10% from 60% to 70% measured by the NYC survey responses and this will result in improved physical, mental and mindfulness among our students

Ms. Atkinson mentioned that the school has started a Wellness center that both students and teachers can use.

Mr. Henry asked what structures or systems are in place to guarantee goal number 1.

Ms. Atkinson responds: Having the social worker and counselor support through Advisory to help students have conversations about getting support from teachers.

We have two social workers and guidance counselors.

Quality Individualized Education Programs (IEPs)

Goal 1: By June 2023 to strengthen the quality and implementation of all IEPs for all students with disabilities —we will increase the alignment of IEPs across present level of performance, the goals, the recommended program and services and this will increase by 5% points moving from 85% to 90% as measured by the IEP review and program service report.

Goal 2: By June 2023 to strengthen the quality and implementation of IEPs for all students with disabilities who are 12 years and older—we want to improve the development of appropriate post secondary goals and transition data from 85% to 90% as measured by IEP review and program service report.

Mr. Henry asked –if the report used to create this goal can identify the teachers who are not writing quality IEPs– how will those teachers be supported?

Ms. Atkinson responds that Special Ed meetings and mentoring with be set up to help new teachers write better IEPs

English Language Arts

Goal 1: By June 2023, middle school ELA for students with disabilities will increase by 5 % from 39% to 44% as measured by the New York State exam.

By June 2023 our ELL learners will increase from 0% to 5% in levels 3 and 4s as measured by the New York State ELA exam.

Mathematics

Goal 1: By June 2023 our students with disabilities will increase by 5% from 17% to 22% as measured by the State Mathematics exam results.

By June 2023, our ENL learners will increase by 5% from 12% to 17% as measured by the State Mathematics exam results.
